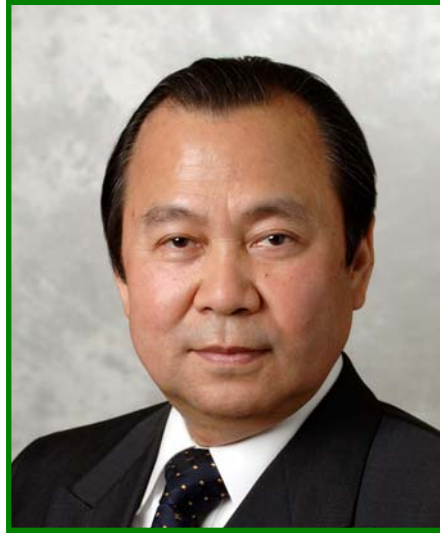

## Ryuzaburo Tanino, M.D.

### Medical Advisory Board

Tanino has made great contributions to the field of plastic and reconstructive surgery. As a

Tanino graduated from Keio University School of Medicine. After completing his internship at the Keio University Hospital, he became an assistant in the department of plastic surgery at the university and a resident at the surgery and orthopedics departments of Toranomon Hospital. In 1975, he began a new post in the department of plastic surgery, Tokai University School of Medicine, and in 1998, became a professor of the department. In 2000, he was appointed as director of the Tokai University Hospital and at the same time as president of the Junior College of Nursing and Medical Technology. His fundamental principle is "the fusion of science and humanism," which was originally addressed by Shigeyoshi Matsumae, the founder and first president of Tokai University.

Currently, Tanino is a board member of the Japan Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, the Japan Society of Cranio-Maxillo-Facial Surgery, and is board-certified in plastic surgery by the Japan Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery and the Japan Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgery. He is a supervisory doctor of the Japan Society for Laser Surgery and Medicine. Tanino has served as the director of the Japan Society of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery; director of the Japan Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgery; as a councilor of the Japanese Society of Anti-Aging Medicine; and as chairman of the Japan Society of Cranio-Maxillo-Facial Surgery.
